Journey to Priesthood

Born on 03 May 1966 in the Philippines, Fr. Alex Poblador entered the Rogationist seminary in Manila on 21 May 1983. He proceeded to do his Novitiate in Cavite on 01 June 1988 and made his first profession a year after. He made his perpetual profession on 02 June 1997 and was ordained a priest on 23 November 2002.

In 2000, he took a Liturgy course and transferred to the Rogationist Community in Cebu. In 2001, he was assigned as a Vocation Promoter and Formation Councilor and became a House Councilor in 2003. He was made in charge of the Benefactors' Office in 2006. He was also appointed as Lay Rogationist Association in Charge in 2007.

Fr. Alex began missionary work in 2009 in Tarragona (Spain). Then, he moved to London in 2014 and worked as a collaborator at Our Lady of Compassion Catholic Church in East London. He then worked as an Assistant Priest at St. James the Less in Colchester from 2015 to 2018 before transferring to his current assignment at Westcliff, Southend.

This feast (Christ the King) was instituted in 1925 by Pope Pius XI to counteract fascist and communist movements that gave governments total power over human lives. His successor, Pope Francis, noted in his homily for Christ the King in 2016: "The grandeur of his kingdom is not defined by this world but by the love of God, a love capable of encountering and healing all things."

In his letter to the Colossians, Paul relates his experience of Christ as the creative force that drives all things in the universe forward; in him we have redemption and forgiveness. And in today's gospel, the second criminal rises above the first's mockery, repents of his wrongdoing, and asks only to be remembered by Jesus. Jesus recognizes his repentance and welcomes this lost sheep into his kingdom. (Integral Faith)
